



Ash Wednesday falls on February 14, 2024. Masses will be at 8 am and 7pm. The blessing and distribution

of ashes at Mass occurs after the homily, using the ritual texts in the *Roman Missal*. Ash Wednesday is a day of universal fast and abstinence in the Church. <u>Since February 14 is</u> <u>celebrated by many couples as Valentine's Day,</u> <u>parishioners should be reminded of the norms</u> <u>governing fasting and abstinence from meat since</u> <u>no dispensation will be given for this day which</u> <u>marks the solemn beginning of Lent.</u>



### Lent-Fasting And Abstinence

Good Friday is a universal day of fasting and abstinence from meat. For members of the Latin Catholic

Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. This would mean that children in Elementary schools are not bound by the law of fasting despite the fact that we often encourage them to eat more modestly and to abstain from treats on such days.




# What is Lent?

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by

reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by <u>giving alms</u>; and we practice self-control through <u>fasting</u>. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. Contemplate the meaning and origins of the Lenten fasting tradition in this <u>reflection</u>. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." *(Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446)* 

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the <u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics. *-USCCB*

# A Brief Examination of Conscience

Based on the Ten Commandments

# I am the LORD your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me.

Have I treated people, events, or things as more important than God?

# You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain.

Have my words, actively or passively, put down God, the Church, or people?

#### Remember to keep holy the LORD's Day.

Do I go to Mass every Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) and on Holy Days of Obligation (Jan. 1; the Ascension; Aug. 15; Nov. 1; Dec. 8; Dec. 25)? Do I avoid, when possible, work that impedes worship to God, joy for the Lord's Day, and proper relaxation of mind and body? Do I look for ways to spend time with family or in service on Sunday?

#### Honor your father and your mother.

Do I show my parents due respect? Do I seek to maintain good communication with my parents where possible? Do I criticize them for lacking skills I think they should have?

#### You shall not kill.

Have I harmed another through physical, verbal, or emotional means, including gossip or manipulation of any kind?

#### You shall not commit adultery.

Have I respected the physical and sexual dignity of others and of myself?

#### You shall not steal.

Have I taken or wasted time or resources that belonged to another?

# You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

Have I gossiped, told lies, or embellished stories at the expense of another?

#### You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse.

Have I honored my spouse with my full affection and exclusive love?

#### You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

Am I content with my own means and needs, or do I compare myself to others unnecessarily?

#### Christ's Two Commandments

How well do we love God and others? Do we love as Christ calls us to? In the Gospel of Matthew, Christ gives us Two Commandments: "He said to him, 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments'" (Mt 22:37-40).

Not sure what love is? St. Paul describes it for us in his Letter to the Corinthians. Is this how you love God and others? "Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, [love] is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quicktempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails" (1 Cor 13:4-8).
