

This weekend's gospel has a powerful message about persistence, patience, and intentionality. Bartimaeus, despite being physically blind, recognizes Jesus as the "Son of David" and cries out persistently for healing, even when others try to silence him. His faith and determination to connect with Jesus lead to his physical healing and newfound spiritual sight. Reflecting on this passage, we are reminded that spiritual blindness can affect anyone. Bartimaeus' story encourages us to think about what might be preventing us from truly seeing Jesus in our daily lives. Is it fear, doubt, or perhaps the voices of others discouraging our faith? Like Bartimaeus, we are called to be persistent in prayer, to trust that Jesus hears us even when the way seems blocked. Jesus' question to Bartimaeus—"What do you want me to do for you?"—invites us into a personal relationship with Him. It is a moment that requires us to be honest about our deepest needs, trusting that God wants to bring healing into the areas of our lives where we are struggling. In today's fast-paced world, this Gospel challenges us to slow down and open our hearts to God's healing power. Whether it's emotional wounds, spiritual doubts, or broken relationships, the healing touch of Jesus is available when we, like Bartimaeus, approach Him with faith. As we journey through life, may we ask ourselves: Are we willing to throw off our "cloaks" of fear or pride, as Bartimaeus did, and run toward the light of Christ? This act of faith can lead to true sight—one that is not just physical, but emotional and spiritual as well.

What does it mean to form my conscience?

Catholics have a long tradition of engagement in the public square. Sometimes that engagement requires making difficult moral decisions that impact our own lives and those of others. Our conscience can help guide the decisions we make. The Second Vatican Council guides us: "Always summoning [one] to love good and avoid evil, the voice of conscience can when necessary speak to [one's] heart more specifically: do this, shun that" (Gaudium et Spes 16). However, our conscience doesn't just come to us when we are born. We must work throughout our lives to form it through prayer, learning, and conversation.

How do I form my conscience?

It takes time to form our consciences so that we can make well-reasoned judgments about particular, real-life situations. The Church teaches that it is important to work continually on conscience formation so we can be prepared to make decisions whenever the opportunity arises. Some specific ideas to form your conscience are:

- Begin by being open to the truth and what is right.
- Study Sacred Scripture and the teaching of the Church.
- Examine the facts and background information about various choices and be discerning in where we gather information.
- Prayerfully reflect to discern the will of God (Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, no. 18).

Additionally, it is important to consider how our community of faith can help us form good consciences through some of these steps:

- Seek the prudent advice and good example of trusted leaders and others to support and enlighten our conscience.
- Learn about the authoritative teaching of the Church.
- Pray for the gifts of the Holy Spirit to help us develop our conscience.
- Regularly partake in an examination of conscience to hear God's voice in your life.¹

Doing the work of forming our consciences can seem daunting. Fortunately, we have many church teachings that can help us in this important task. Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship is an important resource for U.S. Catholics and helps us prayerfully reflect on how we can apply Church teaching in our civic life. "Conscience is not something that allows us to justify doing whatever we want, nor is it a mere "feeling" about what we should or should not do. Rather, conscience is the voice of God resounding in the human heart, revealing the truth to us and calling us to do what is good while shunning what is evil."²

Here are some questions for further reflection:

- 1. When has my conscience guided me to "do good and avoid evil"?
- 2. What are some key resources I can use to form my conscience?
- Forming conscience is a "lifelong task." What do I do to regularly form my conscience? What more should I do?

SACREDNESS OF HUMAN LIFE

"In Rejoice and Be Glad [Gaudete et Exsultate], Pope Francis writes: The call to holiness requires a "firm and passionate" defense of "the innocent unborn." "Equally sacred," he further states, are "the lives of the poor, those already born, the destitute, the abandoned and the underprivileged, the vulnerable infirm and elderly exposed to covert euthanasia, the victims of human trafficking, new forms of slavery, and every form of rejection."

APPLYING A CONSISTENT MORAL FRAMEWORK

"Pope Francis has continued to draw attention to important issues such as migration, xenophobia, racism, abortion, global conflict, and care for creation. In the United States and around the world, many challenges demand our attention.

The threat of abortion remains our preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself, because it takes place within the sanctuary of the family, and because of the number of lives destroyed. At the same time, we cannot dismiss or ignore other serious threats to human life and dignity such as racism, the environmental crisis, poverty and the death penalty."

PRUDENTIAL DISCERNMENT

"The Church's teaching is clear that a good end does not justify an immoral means. As we all seek to advance the common good—by defending the inviolable sanctity of human life from the moment of conception until natural death, by promoting religious freedom, by defending marriage, by feeding the hungry and housing the homeless, by welcoming the immigrant and protecting the environment—it is important to recognize that not all possible courses of action are morally acceptable. We have a responsibility to discern carefully which public policies are morally sound. Catholics may choose different ways to respond to compelling social problems, but we cannot differ on our moral obligation to help build a more just and peaceful world through morally acceptable means, so that the weak and vulnerable are protected and human rights and dignity are defended."

SERVE AS MODELS OF CIVIL DIALOGUE

"Our commitment as people of faith to imitate Christ's love and compassion should challenge us to serve as models of civil dialogue, especially in a context where discourse is eroding at all levels of society. Where we live, work, and worship, we strive to understand before seeking to be understood, to treat with respect those with whom we disagree, to dismantle stereotypes, and to build productive conversation in place of vitriol."

How does the candidate measure up in both words and actions with the totality of Catholic Social Teaching?







CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR PARISHIONER, DOUG MASER

The Lawyers Guild Annual Red Mass was held on Friday, October 18, 2024 at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist. The Most Reverend Edward C. Malesic was the celebrant. Immediately following Mass was a luncheon at the Downtown Marriott at KeyTower where the *St. Thomas More Award* was given to one of our parishioners, Attorney, Douglas J. Maser. Zelie's Home was also recognized for their work with women and children, and two students from Magnificat High School received the Martin T. Galvin Scholarship.

The Red Mass is attended each fall by dozens of judges, attorneys and others affiliated with the legal profession. The Lawyers Guild of the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland hosts the annual event, which roughly coincides with the beginning of the United State Supreme Court's Fall session. It is believed to have originated in the Cathedral of Paris in 1245 to invoice the guidance of the Holy Spirit on the judges of the ecclesiastical courts. The Red Mass refers to the red robes worn by the judges and the red vestments worn by the priests, since red is the liturgical color associated with the Holy Spirit. The Mass was introduced to the U.S. in 1928.


