# **St. Basil Church Renovation FAQs**

#### **Basics**

- The Church building will be closed for renovations from January 13, 2025-April 12, 2025 (Palm Sunday). Parish Office hours remain unchanged.
- Weekend Masses will be held in the Family Life Center (Gym) with Mass times of 5:00 pm Vigil on Saturday and 7:30, 9:00, and 11:00 am on Sunday.
- During this period there will be no 5:30 pm Sunday/"Life Teen" Mass or Livestream.
  Parishioners are invited to live stream the Cathedral Mass at 11:00 am on Sundays at dioceseofcleveland.org/mass
- Weekday Masses will be held in the Parish Center at 8:00 am.

#### Adoration

- Adoration will continue on Mondays and Wednesdays from 8:30 am-9:00 pm in the Chapel as usual. The Chapel will only be accessible from the door marked "Chapel."
- The Church will be closed off. Bathrooms will be accessible.

#### Children's Liturgy of the Word

 Children's Liturgy of the Word will continue during the 9:00 am Mass. The Children will meet in the Family Life Center Meeting Room.

#### Confession

 Confessions will continue on Saturdays from 3:30-4:30 pm. Confessions will take place in the Family Life Center Meeting Room. Each priest will have one side of the meeting room. There will be a screen available, or chairs for face to face.

#### Cry Room

 The Family Life Center Meeting Room will serve as the Cry Room during the Saturday 5:00 pm, Sunday 7:30 am, and Sunday 11:00 am Masses. There will be a live video feed from the Gym with sound. During the Sunday 9:00 am Mass, Parents are encouraged to use the breezeway for a cry room as needed.

#### AT ST. BASIL THE GREAT

Baptism is the gateway to life in the Spirit and the door which gives access to the other sacraments (CCC 1213). It is like birth - indeed, Christ calls it a "new birth" (John 3:5), a birth from above.

Baptism has two effects, one of which takes something away and the other of which gives something. "Through Baptism we are (1) freed from sin and (2) reborn as sons and daughters of God; we become members of Christ incorporated into the Church" (CCC 1213). listen and Watch

What does it mean?

The Church uses different signs and symbols during a Baptism to help our senses realize the mystery of the Sacrament. Here are a few of signs used during Baptism!







Water: Water is essential to any baptism. It reminds us of Jesus, the living water, and the cleansing from original sin that we are given within the Sacrament of Baptism.

Oil: Holy Oils are consecrated each year by the Bishop at the Chrism Mass. The Oil of Catechumen is used first to bless and strengthen before Baptism and the perfumed, Sacred Chrism is used during the Baptism to consecrate.

Candle: The Baptismal Candle is lit from the Easter Candle and represents the flame of faith which is kept burning brightly within the newly baptized!

At St. Basil, all parents are required to complete Baptism preparation in anticipation of the Baptism of their first child. To schedule a Baptism and receive the preparation materials, email baptism@basilthegreat.org.

## **Baptism of the Lord**

The origin and foundation of Christian Baptism is Jesus. Before starting his public ministry, Jesus submitted himself to the baptism given by John the Baptist. The waters did not purify him; he cleansed the waters. ... Jesus did not need to be baptized because he was totally faithful to the will of his Father and free from sin.

However, he wanted to show his solidarity with human beings in order to reconcile them to the Father. By commanding his disciples to baptize all nations, he established the means by which

people would die to sin – Original and actual – and begin to live a new life with God.

The Jubilee Year is a special year of grace, in which the Church offers the faithful the possibility of obtaining plenary indulgences.

Traditionally, it begins just before Christmas and ends on the Epiphany of the following year. In the United States, the Jubilee Year extends from the feast of the Holy Family (December 29, 2024) until December 28, 2025.

The Pope inaugurates the Holy Year with the rite of the opening of the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica. After that, the Holy Doors of the other papal basilicas – St John Lateran, St Paul Outside

the Walls, and St Mary Major – are opened and remain so until the end of the Jubilee Year. (Source: Vatican announces motto of Jubilee Year 2025: 'Pilgrims of Hope')



SACRED HEART COUNSELING SACREDHEART

Christmas, New Year's, and the Baptism of the Lord all capture a theme- *a new start*. The birth of Jesus is a new beginning, New Year's is leaving the previous year behind to look forward to the coming year, and baptism is a cleansing of original sin for new life in Christ. When we are given a new start or opportunity, it can be difficult to let go of our mistakes and the shame surrounding them. While guilt is a good thing that says we *did* something bad, shame is destructive because it tells us we are bad. As we come to an end of the Christmas season and the messages surrounding it, let us remember that shame is of the Evil One and to be rejected. One of the most accurate titles the Evil One has is "The Accuser." Whether it is our own self-critical voice or a spiritual attack, the voice of accusation is not of God. "You failed again, as usual. You always fail. What is wrong with you? You will always fail." Does this sound like the voice of love and encouragement? No. God's voice is of hope and love. The Accuser's is of despair. While we will fail repeatedly and will likely be confessing things repeatedly when we go to reconciliation, this is not reason to despair. When God told us to forgive seventy times seven, we need to remember that this also applies to us and the mistakes we make. The mercy of God is an infinite spring that will never run dry. If we do not remember this, we can easily fall into anxiety, depression, and despair. This week, consider reflecting on the infinite spring of God's mercy and His love for you as you look to the coming year of increased growth, healing, and holiness. -Luke Brown

Exodus 90 is a ninety-day challenge where men take up spiritual disciplines in fraternity to grow closer to God and be better men for their families and community.


Exodus 90 2025 begins January 20, 2025 and ends on Easter, April 20, 2025.








#### THE CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY COLLECTION WILL BE THE WEEKEND OF 18-19 JANUARY 2025


