Beauty is more than in the eye of the beholder

Three elements of beauty:

- Wholeness/integrity: the "thing" lacks nothing; if a car lacks doors, a steering wheel, bumpers and its wheels it can't reveal "car-ness" very well and therefore isn't truly beautiful.
- 2. Proportionality/harmonious: the parts work together towards its final end; for example wearing a wedding dress to a day at the beach seems "off" and therefore is not in harmony and there not truly beautiful, or an orchestra where each person plays a different song is a cacophony and therefore not truly harmony and not beautiful.
- 3. Clarity/light: a flowing out of the object to the perceiver, a kind of radiance that is delighting and not reduced to science. It is the "Stopping in your tracks" of a beautiful sunset or blue ocean, or stunning cathedral. This power to delight, is a essential quality of beauty. This manifestation of the reality of a thing, a "-ness" of a thing being manifest with clarity and to deceiving is what makes something beautiful.





This window speaks deeply to me as it is more than a depiction of Christ's resurrection. The burst of colors and streams behind and surrounding Jesus shouts to me about the alory of God. But it reminds me that the glory of God is implanted




THE MINISTRY OF THE TRAVELING STATUE OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA

One of the most common things that I hear in my work is the response, "You mean this is not normal?" Most of the time, it comes after someone has explained various symptoms of a mental health issue that they thought were a common experience. For example, a college student will hear others talking about test anxiety, trouble sleeping, and difficulty focusing, but there is a difference between mild anxiety and a panic attack. There is also a difference between getting to sleep one hour later due to worry and not getting any sleep at all. My point is that our general conversations about these topics often do not go into those deeper details which can leave people thinking that their experience is typical. While finding out that one's experience is "not normal" can be discouraging or result in self-condemning, it can also bring relief. Finding that you can be worried but not debilitated by anxiety is a cause for hope! Sometimes the beginning of healing is simply finding this self awareness. This does not only apply to anxiety but to a wide spectrum of problems such as depression, anger, trauma, and communication difficulties. Mental health resources such as books, podcasts, and/or therapy can help determine a growth area and find a path forward. "Normal" is not something I am generally concerned about, but it can help us know that relief is out there and that life can be different when we are in the midst of pain and suffering. If this message resonates with you, consider seeking out mental health resources to grow in self awareness and find healing. -Luke Brown


