Stained Glass Spotlight

At first, it seems odd that an angel is appearing to Jesus in order to deliver Him the very device that will end His life. If anything, wouldn't it be more fitting for Satan to deliver it to Him? It is crucial that we remember why God the Father permitted this to occur. Jesus came to Earth for one primary purpose: to offer Himself as a sacrificial lamb in order that humanity may be saved.

It is also important to note that this event took place just after Jesus instituted the Eucharist at the Last Supper. Every Sunday, we honor the Lord's command from the Last Supper to "do this in memory of Me." What is it precisely that we are doing? Jesus, the sacrificial lamb who died for our sins, asks us to perpetually offer the sacrifice of Calvary to God the Father for our salvation. Eucharistic Prayer IV makes this very clear saying, "We offer you his Body and Blood, the sacrifice acceptable to you which brings salvation to the whole world."

In the original church this window is from, the sanctuary contains three large stained glass windows. One depicts the Last Supper, another depicts the Passion of Christ (this window), and the last depicts the Resurrection. At every Mass, we enter into the full Paschal mystery (CCC 1085). The combination of these three events surrounding the altar in the sanctuary gives a great image of what is happening at Mass. Fortunately, St Basil also will feature these three scenes! I hope that our own combination of windows will help accomplish the same for us!

When I heard this week's Gospel as a younger man,

the disciples leaving their boats on the shore and following Jesus was not noteworthy to me. Half the people I knew had boats and if someone gave one away, it would not have been a big deal. Then I learned in a Scripture class that boats in Jesus' time were hard to come by, difficult to make, and relied upon for livelihood. For the disciples to leave the boats is the equivalent of someone today permanently surrendering a college degree, medical license, or other livelihood. Leaving the boats suddenly became a very powerful thing when I reread today's passage. I can only imagine how intimidating and scary it was for the disciples to be led into the unknown and simply asked to trust. When I reflect on this in regard to mental health, I think about how quickly our lives can change when we least expect it. Illness, an accident, death of a loved one, or losing a job can change our life in very dramatic ways. We are left feeling numb and, like the disciples, exploring unknown territory. I imagine that trust was difficult at times for the disciples. I'm sure that they second-guessed many things about Jesus and about their decision to follow Him. After all, they were still very much human. However, the continued trust that the disciples had in Jesus taught them new ways of thinking, loving, and praying that resulted in peace and their sainthood. When our lives take an unexpected turn, good or bad, it is important that we remain mindful of God's presence in all of it and our need to remain faithful, trusting, and prayerful. If you find that your life is different than you thought it would be or has recently taken an unexpected turn, consider reflecting on the disciples from today's Gospel and the uncertainty that was replaced with trust in Jesus. - Luke Brown



The Year of the Jubilee 2025: Pilgrims of Hope The Jubilee Year is a special year of grace, in which the Church offers the faithful the possibility of obtaining a plenary indulgence. Bishop Malesic has designated ten locations as Sacred Sites and places of pilgrimage in the Diocese of Cleveland at which the plenary indulgence may be obtained:

• Cathedral of St. John The Evangelist, Cleveland • Immaculate Conception Parish, Madison • Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish, Lorain • Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine, Euclid • Queen of

Heaven Parish, Uniontown • Queen of the Holy Rosary Shrine, Parma Heights • Shrine of Saint Ann, Highland Heights • St. Colette Parish, Brunswick • St. Edward Parish, Ashland • St. Mary Parish, Chardon

An indulgence, according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, is "a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints." "An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin." Indulgences may be applied to the living or the dead. In short, although we receive forgiveness for sins through the sacrament of Reconciliation, further purification is needed.

Here are the basic elements to receive an indulgence: In addition to being truly repentant and desiring the indulgence, the faithful are to go to confession, attend Mass, pray for the Pope and his intentions, and also complete one of the following: • Undertake a pious pilgrimage to a Sacred Site: devoutly participate in Holy Mass, anointing of the sick, celebration of the Word of God, Liturgy of the Hours, the Way of the Cross, the Marian Rosary, or penitential celebration. Visit a Sacred Site: engage in Eucharistic adoration and meditation, concluding with the Our Father, the Profession of Faith, and the invocations to Mary, Mother of God. • Participate in: a mission, spiritual exercises or formation activities on the documents of the Second Vatican Council and the Catechism of the Catholic Church, held in a church or other suitable place . • Participate in works of mercy and penance: the corporal or spiritual works of mercy, visiting the sick and imprisoned, feeding the hungry, welcoming the migrant, observing the penitential nature of Friday, etc... What does it mean?

The Church uses different signs and symbols during Weddings to help our senses realize the mystery of the Sacrament.



Vows: The vows exchanged by the bride and groom enter the couple into a covenant of free, total, faithful and fruitful, love.



Rings: The rings represent the never-ending covenant of marriage "until death do us part."



White: A bride's dress is traditionally white, which in the Church represents purity, holiness, and is the liturgical color of celebration!



Couples who plan to be married at St. Basil are required to make an appointment with a parish priest or deacon at least six months prior to the proposed wedding date. The preparation process will be explained to the couple at that meeting, and the wedding date and time will be reserved in the Mass book.

To help couples prepare, there is a Pre-Cana Retreat at St. Basil each year. This is a one-day retreat designed to create an increased awareness of the responsibilities and realities of Christian married life. A team of married couples are the presenters. This year's Pre Cana Day is






